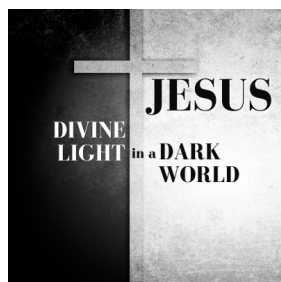
From Pastor Chuck's Desk



We'll Leave The Light On

"We'll leave the light on for you" is probably one of the most iconic slogans of our time, as Motel 6 wanted to sound warm and inviting to weary travelers. In the 19th century, we had lamplighters. They would go around the streets at dusk and light the streetlamps and then come back at dawn and put the lights out. They left the light on during the night and lit up the darkness.

We are called to leave our light on. The apostle Paul told the Philippians to shine brightly for Christ. Philippians 2:12-15 *"Dear friends, you always followed my instructions when I was with you. And now that I am away, it is even more important. Work hard to show the results of your salvation, obeying God with deep reverence and fear. For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him. Do everything without complaining and arguing, so that no one can criticize you. Live clean, innocent lives as children of God, shining like bright lights in a world full of crooked and perverse people."* We live in a dark world. Isaiah 60:2 *"Darkness as black as night covers all the nations of the earth, but the glory of the Lord rises and appears over you."* Darkness is for lying down to sleep; light is for rising. When the light comes, we must respond and arise and shine. Jesus Christ is the true Light, who gives light to everyone.



Jesus said in the Sermon on the Mount that we are to be the light of the world. Matthew 5:14-16 *"You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. 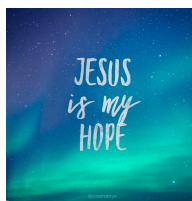

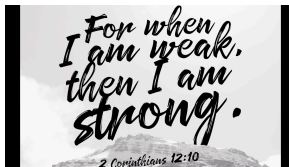
